Author Guidelines

Colloquia Comparativa Litterarum publishes peer-reviewed studies in Comparative Literature with an emphasis on the European literatures, focusing in particular on Balkan issues and mainly on the period from the 18th century until today.

Texts, submitted for publication, are sent by the editors for anonymous peer review by two independent experts in the field. The evaluation period takes between 2 and 3 months. After that, **Colloquia Comparativa Litterarum** will provide clear and constructive feedback to all authors regardless of the editorial decision.

Papers for the journal's upcoming issue will be accepted until November 30th of the current year. Please send your text submissions to the Editorial Board of Colloquia Comparativa Litterarum by email (colloquiacl@gmail.com)

Submission requirements:

- Microsoft Word and PDF format.
- Line spacing 1.5, Times New Roman, size 12.
- Italic is to be used for: foreign language phrases; specialized terminology; accenting on certain words or short quotations.
- Please, avoid underlining.
- Citations, longer than 3 lines, are to be separated by an empty row from the rest of the text. Footnotes are to be written at the bottom of the page with indexes from 1 to infinity (size 10, Times New Roman), and the bibliography (if any) at the end of the article.
- All illustrations, figures and tables are to be placed within the text at the appropriate positions rather than at the end.
- Preferably, the text length ought to be maximum 22000 characters (including spaces, footnotes, summary, bibliography and illustrations).
- A summary (up to 600 characters) is to be provided in one of the journal's other languages, different from the language of the paper.
- Book review articles should be between 5000 and 10000 characters.

By submitting his or her article for publication in **Colloquia Comparativa Litterarum**, each author, automatically and gratuitously, grants the journal the right to publish his text in the language in which it was submitted. For republishing, it is necessary to obtain permission from the editors of Colloquia Comparativa Litterarum.
